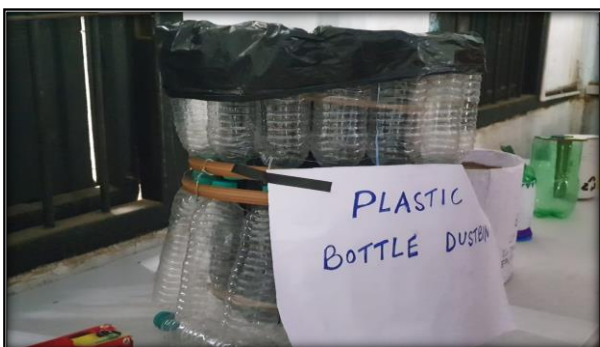

Ceremonial launch of “A Week for LiFE”

The ceremonial launching of “A week for LiFE” was held on 21 March, 2023 at GMCH New Auditorium under the initiative of Science, Technology & Climate Change Department, Govt. of Assam and Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Govt. of India. The launching event was graced by Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma, Hon’ble Chief Minister of Assam, Shri Keshab Mahanta, Hon’ble Minister, Science, Technology & Climate Change, Govt. of Assam, Shri. Urkhao Gwra Brahma, Hon’ble Minister Handlooms and Textiles, Govt. of Assam, Ms. Imtiena Ao, IFS, Deputy Director General of Forests (Central), Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Govt. of India & Dr. P.L.N. Raju, Director, Assam State Space Application Centre (ASSAC). Hon’ble Chief Minister stated that human actions against nature have caused numerous problems for humanity and the environment at large. This initiative aims to encourage an environmentally conscious lifestyle, with a focus on utilizing resources rather than engaging in wasteful consumption.

Key note speaker of the event, Ms. Imtiena Ao, IFS, Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Govt. of India, gave an overview of the Environment Education Programme (EEP) and Environmental Information, Awareness, Capacity Building and Livelihood Programme (EIACP) of the Ministry. 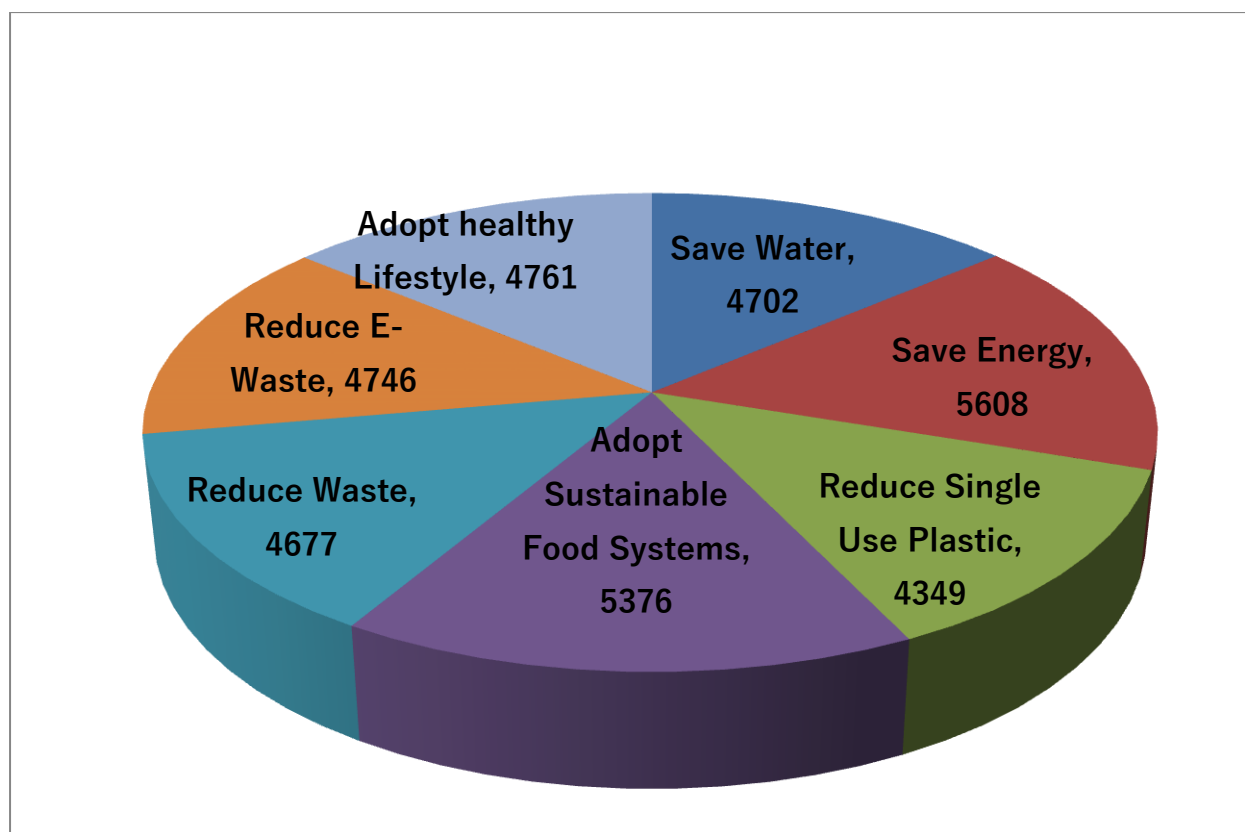

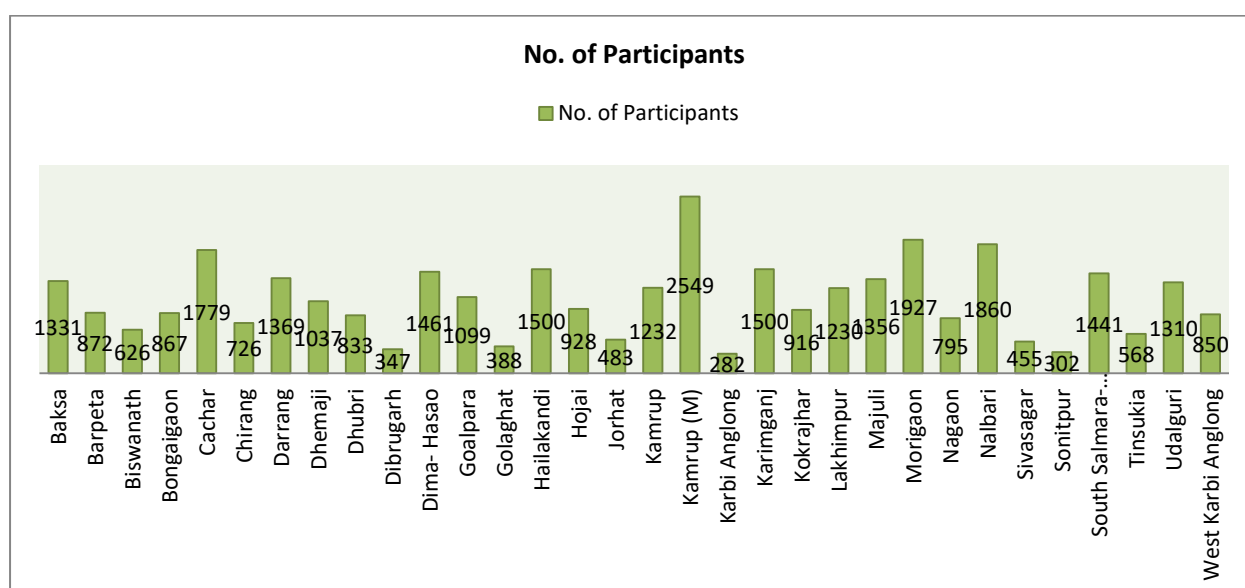
